

Salmonella Africana/ (b)(5) (suspect)/Nov 2025 - CARA ID 1351 On 11/18/2025, CORE Signals was notified by CDC of a new outbreak of Salmonella Africana with cases. CDC identified as the leading hypothesis for this outbreak based on the preliminary epidemiologic information. CORE conducted a traceback investigation for products purchased by cases from points of service (POS) across states: . brands of products were identified during this traceback, . These brands each had unique manufacturing facilities in . for these manufacturers were sourced from the were supplied to all manufacturers. were and farm names were not known to the manufacturers. FDA collected a total of import samples and state partners collected a total of product from retail locations and the home of one ill person. All samples were negative. full scope inspections were conducted by the Office of Global Policy and Strategy/ at the manufacturers for the brands of interest; .
